**RE: Annual Report on Academic Honesty Cases  
2022-2023**

Dear Dr. Christ:

In accordance with A Culture of Honesty, the university's academic honesty policy and procedures, we are providing the University Council with the attached report for the 2022-2023 academic year. Semester reports are on the [website](#). We are also pleased to report on the following highlights from our office:

- Created a Graduate Academic Honesty Module to integrate with the [GradFirst Program](#) with 665 students enrolled and 377 completed in Fall/Spring/Summer; the Undergraduate Module had 1908 students enrolled and 1110 students completed (all incoming students enrolled for Fall 2023);
- Created an Instructor Toolkit on eLC and enrolled all instructors. The toolkit includes resources on GenAI, literature on academic integrity, and easy to access information on the UGA policy and procedures;
- Implemented a Restorative Justice based [Remediation Program](#) including peer educators and faculty representatives – 144 students enrolled, 22 students have completed it in the first year; and
- Presented at the [International Center for Academic Integrity \(ICAI\) annual conference](#) in March 2023 and collaborated with other ICAI institutions in the [Southeast region](#) to create GenAI guidelines for faculty and students

In addition to administering the university's academic honesty policy and speaking to numerous groups of students, faculty and teaching assistants, we continue to make every effort to resolve faculty concerns about possible cases of academic dishonesty quickly and fairly. We appreciate the assistance provided by our faculty and professional staff who assist in facilitating academic honesty discussions, the service of faculty and students who volunteer to serve as panel members, and to those who support and promote academic integrity at UGA by reporting concerns, requesting speakers, and seeking guidance about issues of possible academic dishonesty.

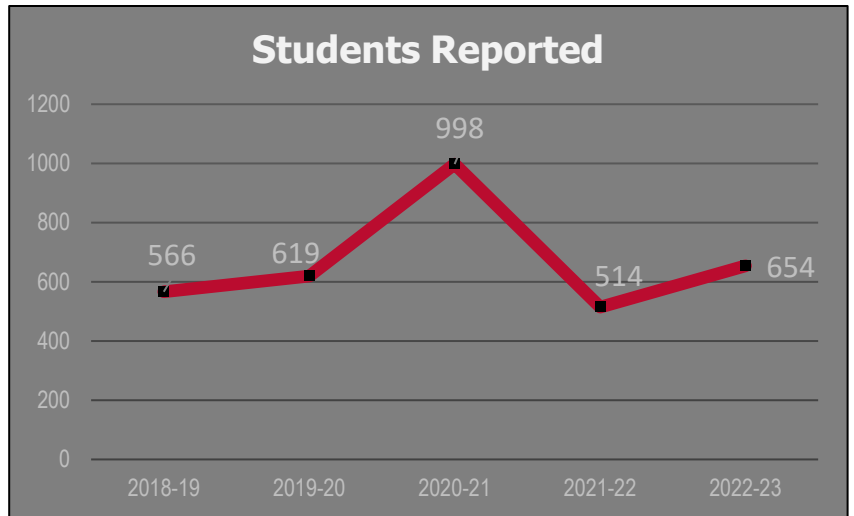


## Overview

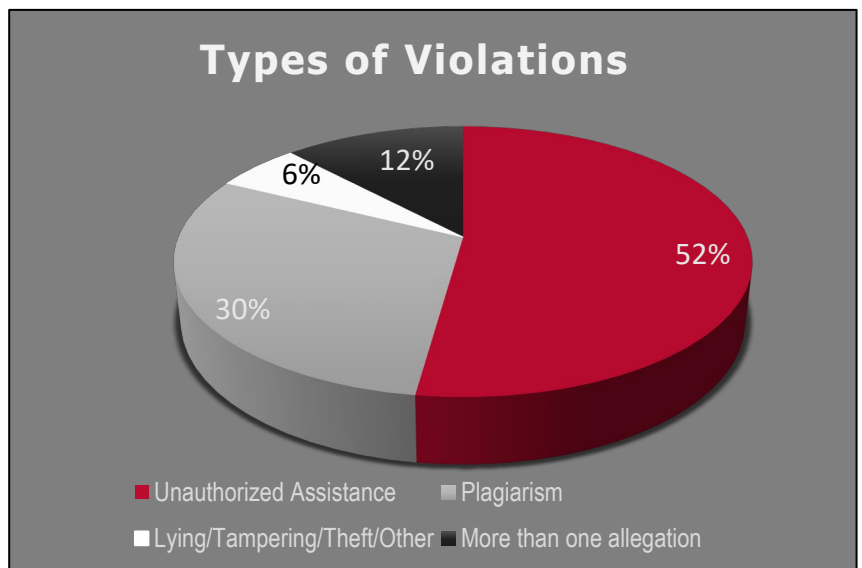
