NAME CHANGE JUSTIFICATION FORM

Current Certificate Name: Undergraduate Certificate in Integrated Pest Management

Proposed Certificate Name: Undergraduate Certificate in Plant Health Management

Justification:

Although the term Integrated Pest Management (IPM) has been in use since the 1970s to describe a multidisciplinary approach toward managing arthropod pests, plant diseases, and weeds, IPM has come under increased criticism for being reactive, focused mostly on optimization of pesticide applications, and lacking integration among the plant protection disciplines (e.g., Ehler, L. E. and Bottrell, D. G. 2000. "The Illusion of Integrated Pest Management." Issues in Science and Technology 16(3), http://www.issues.org/l6.3/ehler.htm). Moreover, the term "pest" often evokes images of household insect pests among students and the general public rather than the broad range of biotic and abiotic agents that affect crop and amenity plantings in agricultural and horticultural settings. To address these concerns and emphasize the need for a holistic and preventative approach toward understanding and managing biotic and abiotic constraints in crop production, we request that the name of the Certificate in Integrated Pest Management be changed to Certificate in Plant Health Management.

The proposed name changed was supported unanimously in a Department of Plant Pathology faculty meeting on 31 May 2017.
