The Full University Curriculum Committee met on March 15, 2024, at 3:30 p.m. in 327 Brooks Hall. Since the last Report to the University Council, the committee approved 38 new courses and 9 course changes.

The committee unanimously approved the following proposals, which were forwarded to the Executive Committee of the University Council for consideration:

- Proposal for a new Undergraduate Certificate in Aerospace Engineering
- Proposal for a new Undergraduate Certificate in Wildlife Health
- Proposal to offer the existing major in Higher Education (M.Ed.) online
- Proposal for a new major in Couple and Family Therapy (M.S.)

The committee continued discussion about the Course Prerequisite Subcommittee and their draft of a policy proposal. Additional documentation regarding those meetings, along with a copy of the proposal draft, will be provided to the committee members to aid in further discussion.

The committee continued discussion about variable credit courses. A list of currently approved variable credit courses was sent to members for review prior to the meeting. Members discussed the need for transparency in variable credit course offerings and what updates they would like to see made to CAPA and to the course submission and revision process. It was decided that documentation would be developed to aid units with updating variable credit course information.

The Provost gave an update on the School of Medicine, including accreditation, faculty, and resources, as well as an update on the curriculum currently under development for the School.

The Provost gave an update on revisions to the General Education Core Curriculum.
