JUSTIFICATION:

The Institute for Women's Studies requests a name change to the Institute for Women's and Gender Studies. Name changes of three academic programs offered by the institute—Women's Studies (A.B.), the minor in Women's Studies, and the Graduate Certificate in Women's Studies—are also requested.

The requested names more accurately reflect the faculty areas of research and teaching, as well as the growing curriculum. The existing interdisciplinary foundation of scholarship in the field includes a focus on women's lives, narratives, and leadership, and expands into the study of gender as an analytical category in social, cultural, economic, political, historical, and scientific dimensions. The institute already offers many courses that include gender studies and conducts research on gender.

The institute was recently awarded a \$100,000 Affirming Multivocal Humanities grant from the Mellon Foundation to fund undergraduate research, creative projects, and a pedagogical network focused on best practices around women's and gender studies in the region. Already ranked 11th in the United States for undergraduate degrees awarded in Women's Studies¹, keeping current with national trends will contribute to the strengthening and growth of the program.

Nationally, the field of women's studies has become more widely recognized as women's and gender studies, with most programs in the nation including "gender studies" in their title². Thus, the proposed name will enhance the Institute's ability to recruit and retain students as it signals a broader and more attractive focus. Two recent undergraduate student focus groups of more than fifteen students in each group suggested the proposed name more accurately describes the major, and students have consistently recommended this change.

On September 20, 2023, the faculty in the Institute unanimously voted in support for the change to the unit and program names.
