The Full University Curriculum Committee met on January 17, 2025, at 3:30 p.m. in 327 Brooks Hall. Since the last Report to the University Council, the committee approved 137 new courses and 494 course changes.

The committee unanimously approved the following proposals, which were forwarded to the Executive Committee of the University Council for consideration:

The proposal was then unanimously approved with the revised name and was forwarded to the Executive Committee of the University Council for consideration.

The committee considered a proposal to revise the Entrance Requirements of the major in Computer Science (B.S.). A motion to revise the language of the proposed Entrance Requirements was made and seconded. The motion was approved. Following discussion of the proposal, a motion to approve the revised proposal was made and seconded. A vote was taken and the proposal was approved.
