## **Continuation of SGA Initiatives**

- <u>Professional Clothing Closet</u>: After serving over 1,100 students last year (>200% increase from the prior year), the SGA Professional Clothing Closet has already exceeded 380 students served this term. PCC Executive Director Sophia Beasley has expanded the closet's presence across campus, partnering with the Career Center, Homecoming, Orientation, and even traveling to Delta's Atlanta Headquarters for a highly successful clothing drive with UGA Alumni.
- <u>Fresh Express</u>: With Student Affairs' continued support of resources to address food insecurity,
  Fresh Express looks forward to partnering with recently hired basic needs coordinator Julia
  Buwick to expand its reach on campus.

## **Recent SGA Events/Initiatives**

- Rollout of Commuter Dining Plan: Due to student demand for a meal plan with a lower minimum threshold for meal swipes, SGA was able to successfully work with Auxiliary Services to bring forward a new 45-swipe commuter meal plan this fall.
- Expansion of Tate Food Pantry: The SGA leadership team was able to tour the new space for the Tate Student Food Pantry as it prepares to move from a small closet to a 1,200 sqft space on the first floor of Tate. We are grateful for Student Affairs' receptiveness to student demand for a larger space.

## **Transportation Changes**

- <u>Changes to New Bus Routes</u>: The SGA Leadership team was able to review the new bus routes implemented this fall and appreciate TPS's willingness to reevaluate the system to adapt to traffic patterns.
