The Full University Curriculum Committee met on September 29, 2006. Since the last report to University Council, the committee approved 54 new courses and 41 course changes.

The committee approved and forwarded the following proposal for a major name change under the Ph.D.:

From: Counseling and Student Personnel Services

To: College Student Affairs Administration

This proposal has been withdrawn to allow for consideration by the Graduate School.

After much discussion, the committee approved the following proposal which will be forwarded to the Executive Committee of University Council for consideration:

Revised Academic Affairs Policy Statement #14, General Education Curriculum

It was agreed that a cover letter should accompany the proposal that helps to clarify the differences between the existing Core Curriculum and the Proposed General Education Curriculum and why these changes are being proposed.

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The committee approved a proposal for an Area of Emphasis in Pharmaceutical and Biomedical Sciences under the M.S. and Ph.D. in Pharmacy with a clarification of wording.

The committee approved a request to add the following courses to Area E of the current Core Curriculum: CLAS 2110, CLAS 2113, and HIST 2011.

The committee also approved a request from the School of Forestry and Natural Resources for a new prefix: FANR, Forestry and Natural Resources.


