The Comparative Literature Department would like to submit this proposal of a degree merger (Chinese and Japanese majors) into a new A.B degree: Asian Languages and Literature, A.B. The rational follows from concerns from the Board of Regions and the College of Arts and Sciences that both majors were not graduating an average of ten graduates in three years. A recommendation was made to the College in the 2015 fall semester to terminate both majors but the College proposed (same time) a merger that would include other Asian programs in the Department (Korean with prospects in the future for Vietnamese, and Hindi). The Department met and faculty agreed to support the proposal of a merger from the College.

The merits of the merger include the fact that it would allow the Department to maintain the interest shown for these majors by students interested in the study of Asia and other career goals. Many of our graduates have secured prominent positions in global companies, agencies and institutions. The majors are also an attraction to students from units across campus particularly the Business School, the Colleges of International and Public Affair and Journalism, and the Honors Program.

The proposal by the College was accepted by the Academic Systems at the beginning of this semester. With that, the Department embarked of the proposal before you for the merger. It is my hope that the proposal will be well received by your committee.
