8. Abstract of the deactivated or terminated program

The A.B. in Italian was identified as a low-producing major. As described below, we will not be terminating the actual degree, only renaming it.

The A.B. in Italian will be terminated as such but will be combined with the already existing A.B. in Romance Languages as one of the areas of concentration offered. We currently offer an A.B. in Romance Languages where students can concentrate on Portuguese or a combination of any of the Romance Languages taught in the department (French, Italian, Portuguese, and Spanish). As a low enrolling program, the termination of the A.B. in Italian and its combination with the A.B. in Romance Languages will ensure that we can continue to offer an undergraduate degree in the Italian language, literature, and culture. Students currently enrolled in the program will continue with the same plan of study and be expected to fulfill the same requirements. Thus, the combining of the Italian (A.B.) with the Romance Language (A.B.) will not affect either the currently enrolled students in the program nor the faculty and staff involved in the program. The termination of the Italian (A.B.) and its combining with the Romance Language (A.B.) will only serve to strengthen all of the programs in the department. Graduates of the program will be eligible to apply to the M.A. in Romance Languages with a concentration in Italian.
