Re: Motion passed by Executive Committee at the March 1, 2017 meeting, proposing a 2018-2019 academic calendar that is consistent with USG and federal requirements

Dear members of University Council and the UGA Community:

At its March 1, 2017 meeting, the University Council Executive Committee passed a motion to bring forth an additional academic calendar for consideration at the March 22 University Council meeting. Executive Committee, like other committees of University Council, is permitted by the University Bylaws to place items on the University Council agenda by majority vote. This "Executive Committee Proposed Calendar" is attached here. In this cover letter, I will provide a brief explanation of what led to this motion, as well as the relevant policy under consideration.

This motion was brought after extensive discussion, expression of concerns about length and early start date, and a split vote concerning the calendar proposed by the Educational Affairs Committee (this EAC calendar is found elsewhere on the University Council agenda). The Executive Committee vote on the EAC Calendar (i.e., our vote on whether to place it on the University Council agenda) was 9 yes, 13 no. This fell just short of the two-thirds majority needed to reject the motion, so the EAC calendar will be considered at Council.

Given some Executive Committee members' concerns over the EAC calendar, we agreed after some discussion on an additional proposed calendar that would align with the Board of Regents rules about length of semester, which are found here:

The main issue of discussion concerns the requirements for "length of instructional term" in each semester. The Board of Regents changed their calendar rules in October 2016 (the first link above), and they are now identical to federal guidelines. The relevant USG / federal policy states: "A week of instructional time is any week in which at least one day of regularly scheduled instruction or examinations occurs or, after the last scheduled day of classes for a term or payment period, at least one day of study for final examinations occurs."

The Board of Regents requires two semesters, each with 15 instructional weeks. The attached Executive Committee calendar meets this requirement, with 15 instructional weeks *plus* an additional weeks of final exams. In other words, the attached "Executive Committee Proposed Calendar" contains 15 instructional weeks (as defined and required by USG / federal policy) for both fall and spring semester, plus an additional week of final exams in both semesters (that is, finals are *not* included in our 15 instructional weeks).

In contrast, the EAC calendar contains 16 instructional weeks (as weeks are defined by USG / federal policy), plus an additional week of final exams after that. That is to say, the EAC calendar is a week longer than USG policy requires.

The start dates on this Executive Committee Proposed Calendar align with the start dates at Georgia State University (which already has their 2018-2019 calendar posted), and retains the same ending dates and final exam periods as the EAC calendar. In other words, this Executive Committee Proposed Calendar establishes a semester start date that aligns with other USG research institutions, in order to be responsive to the requests of the Student Government Association (SGA had requested that we align our start date with other schools in Georgia so that students will not be disadvantaged for work, internship, conference, experiential learning, and study abroad opportunities relative to their peers at other institutions).

Both calendars will be discussed and voted on at the March University Council meeting. My hope is that this cover letter will clear up some common misconceptions about terminology and policy that have plagued earlier discussions.

In summary:

- Two calendars will be considered at the March Council meeting
- Both calendars meet ALL USG / federal guidelines that govern our calendar policy
- The Executive committee calendar has 15 instructional weeks (as defined by USG / federal policy) and a start date that aligns with other USG research institutions
- The EAC calendar has 16 instructional weeks and an earlier start date than other USG research institutions
- Neither of these calculations of length of instructional term "count final exams" as part of the instructional term
