PROPOSAL FOR MINOR PROGRAM OF STUDY

School/College: College of Education

Department/Division: Counseling and Human Development Services

Proposed Program: Human Services Leadership

Proposed Starting Date for Program: Spring 2016

Program Descriptions:

The Human Services Leadership minor will expose students to the work of a wide variety of human service agencies and will cultivate the skills and perspectives necessary to be effective in those settings. The Human Services Leadership minor will complement such majors as Social Work, Psychology, Sociology, Health Promotion and Behavior, and Human Development and Family Sciences, extending the range of applications of those fields while also preparing students for potential graduate work in those and other areas.

No additional faculty will be needed to teach these courses for the minor.

- ECHD 3030, Diversity and Helping Skills (3 hours)
